- 1987—broke UGA's indoor vault record at 15-5 $\frac{3}{4}$
- 1988-broke UGA's 19 year old outdoor record at 15-11 $\frac{3}{4}$
- 1988-was the first UGA athlete to break the 16 foot barrier at 16-3
- 1989—senior season—set the UGA vault record at 16-6, which is currently still the 6th best all time in school history.
- Was voted as MVP of the UGA track team as a senior
- Was voted as team captain

Glenn finished his BS in education at UGA and is also a commissioned officer in the United States Air Force.
